



DON'T HAVE THE QUALIFICATIONS WE'RE LOOKING FOR?

Our flexible approach to learning means you can still apply for a course that interests you even if you do not meet the specific criteria. If you don't have all the qualifications required or have a degree in an unrelated area, then please contact us. We may consider knowledge and skills gained through previous training along with your work experience as counting towards your academic potential. Please note that this is not an option for some of our professional courses where all elements of the entry requirements must be fully met.

DBS CHECKS

Enhanced checks by the Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) are required for entry on to some of our courses, which will identify criminal convictions. Criminal convictions are not always a barrier to entry but must be taken into account. DBS checks are undertaken through our University, and must be completed before starting your course.

International applicants, those without British citizenship, and British citizens with a significant period of overseas residency also require a criminal records check or certificate of conduct from their home country, or countries in which they have lived, prior to entry on to the course, in addition to the DBS check.

WHEN TO APPLY

For most of our postgraduate courses there are no specific deadlines, but we recommend you submit your application as soon as possible. Courses start in January, September, and in some cases, April and May. If you apply for a course in health or education there may be a specific deadline,

so please check individual course entries for information.

You can apply for a research degree at any time during the year.

DOCUMENTS REQUIRED WHEN APPLYING

Once you have completed all sections of the application form you will need to upload the following documents with your application:

- Certificates/transcripts of academic qualifications.
- Personal statement.
- At least one reference (unless your chosen course specifies two).
- Proof of English language level (not required if you already have a UK degree).

Some courses have additional requirements. Please check the 'Entry Requirements' section of the course information page.

You will not be charged an admission fee for your postgraduate application when you apply directly to us however for courses such as MA Social Work and PGCEs, which must be applied for via UCAS, there is an application fee of £12 for a single choice or £23 for more than one. For 2017 entry, the fee will be £13 or £24.




