

SOFTSCAPE MATERIALS

1			Betula Pendula 'Purpurea' Tree. Dark purple/red in spring then slowly turns to purple/dark green throughout the summer and finally bronze/purple tones			The striking purple colour will be visual impact on the eyes.
2			Prunus 'Royal Burgundy'. Deep wine coloured foliage with candyfloss pink, blousy flowers in March-April. In Autumn they have dark purple/scarlet leaves.			The candyfloss like flowers are a striking plant that will create a great view for people to experience colour and shape.
3			Salix purpurea 'Pendula' It's a lovely small weeping willow with purple stems that carry catkins before the leaves open. It has a generous colour in spring.			The candyfloss like flowers are a striking plant that will create a great view for people to experience colour and shape.
4			Acer palmatum 'Emerald Lace'. In spring it has bright, lime green colouring. In summer they are red. In autumn the foliage takes on a red-orange hue.			The senses of this tree will give the viewer a calming feel, especially when the wind blows through the stems and leaves.
5			Acer palmatum 'Beni Maiko' is pink/bright red, foliage in the spring which turns pinkish-red, with green in the summer, and orange/fiery red autumn colours.			The bright pink and red colours will attract people and create a colourful environment.
6			Salix integra 'Hakuro-Nishiki' Tree. In spring and summer, pink tipped small leaves sit against a back drop of green and white. In winter yellow catkins appear on bare orange/brown branches.			The change in the plant over the seasons will be a very aesthetically pleasing and create interest throughout the year.
7			Amelanchier x grandiflora 'Autumn Brilliance' In spring, the young foliage emerges bronze. Autumn foliage is a mixture of red and orange.			The flowers in spring are lightly fragrant and very popular with bees and butterflies. In summer, the Juneberries arrive which are eaten by birds. This will attract people to watch.
8			Malus 'Royal Beauty' has deep red/purple flowers in April-May. The flowers are followed by small, dark-purple fruits in autumn. In spring, the leaves turn a deep red/plum colour with a hint of green.			The deep reds and purple flowers on this plant will allow for a bring colour to enter the space and a pop of colour into the environment.

18			Lily of the Valley 'Convallaria majalis' is known for its delicate white blossoms and sweet scent.			This plant will be a great for the sense of SMELL for people. They will get a sweet aroma when they walk into the space.
19			Hyacinth 'Hyacinthus orientalis'. When its in bloom, you'll often sniff it out before you see it. In the spring, hyacinth can be found in a range of pink, purple, and blue			Hyacinths have a powerful scent which can be described as floral green with vegetation aquatic accents and sweet and spicy notes.
20			Lupinus 'Rachel de Thame'. Lupinus can be annuals, perennials or shrubs, with palmate leaves and showy terminal racemes of pea-like flowers			Lupinus' are an eye-catching plant, due to there pea-like flowers and the shape that it creates. This makes it eye-catching selection in the space.
21			Blue delphiniums 'Delphinium grandiflorum' Plants come in deep blue, medium blue, pale blue, white, and light pale pink			This plants interesting array of blues as a brightness within the space, and allows multiple colours within it, making it visually pleasing place.
22			Achillea 'Cerise Queen' is a particularly colourful yarrow, bearing cerise pink flower heads with dark margins and paler colouring in the centre.			The plant will also allow visually pleasing aspects into the space and peoples eye will be drawn to the colour.
23			Red Dahlias 'Dahlia coccinea' The flowers can be orange, yellow, as well as the more common red.			Red Dahlias will bring natural colour into the environment and peoples eyes will be enlightened by the bright petals.
24			Salvia 'Salvia patens' The flowers generally produce a showy display with flower colours ranging from blue to red, with white and yellow.			These small flowers range in colour and will add small pops of colour into the space, adding small elements of colour into a space.
25			Foxglove Pam's Choice 'Digitalis purpurea' The flower spikes, produced in summer, consist of white bells heavily-marked inside with deep red-purple			The Foxglove plants are a very delicate flower, that will entice peoples eyes in, due to the shape and the pure colour.
26			Cosmos 'Cosmos bipinnatus' can be annuals or perennials with simple or pinnately divided leaves and large, long-stalked daisy-like flowers in summer			The colours on these flowers are very bright and the contrast is an eye-catching display.
27			Oriental poppies 'Papaver orientale' has divided leaves and glowing orange-red flowers, each petal with a black spot at the base			Oriental poppies are great to attract people towards them as they are commonly known and will add light colour to the space.

9			Hawthorn 'Crataegus monogyna', is one of the most wildlife-friendly trees you can grow. The species can reach 6-8m in height.			It's a caterpillar food plant for a number of moths, bees visit the flowers in spring and birds love the calorie-rich berries in autumn.
10			Amelanchier 'Amelanchier lamarckii' has white, showy blossom in early spring and purple fruit in summer. In autumn, its leaves fade from dark green to gold.			This tree will be great for the sight all year round, this is due to the change in colour that it changes each season.
11			Coral Bells 'Heuchera genus' can range from orange, silver, purple, and lime leaves with interesting veining and ruffles on many cultivars.			The combination of colours creates an interesting array of vibrant flooring and shrubs. This will allow people to take in the sky and floor with vegetation.
12			Rainbow Fizz Spirea. In early spring, the foliage is coppery red. In summer the leaves change to gold, yellow, and orange, with pink blooms almost all summer long.			This shrub is a living rainbow, attracting the eye and showing interest throughout the year. Adding amazing amounts of colour all through the year.
13			Strobe Weigela is covered in trumpet-shaped flowers in the spring, First, the foliage is green and bronze. Then it ages to orange.			The orange colour adds additional brightness into the space, and the foliage will spread well within the area.
14			Jasmine - common white jasmine is known for its sweet scent. A growing zine dotted with delicate white flowers.			Jasmine produces a sweet, rich fragrance when blooming, this will be great for peoples sense of smell ad they will experience a lovely scent
15			Freesia - Often described as smelling like strawberries or fruit and comes in vibrant shades of purple, yellow, pink, and red.			Having multiple fragranced flowers will be a great way to experience scent to the fullest and enter the space with rich aromas of fruit.
16			Lavender - Its soothing scent, science has even proven the stress-reducing effects of sniffing lavender.			Having Lavender within the space will be a great addition as the smell has been proven to reduce stress and make a calming space
17			Perennial Ryegrass - establishes rapidly, is high yielding with a long growing season, is highly nutritious, recovers well from grazing and tolerates traffic.			The smell and feel of the grass will create a calming environment and allow feeling the ground cover.

HARDSCAPE MATERIALS

1			Ipe wood decking. Durability & longevity, resistant to rot & insects, minimal warping, beautiful colours & grains and doesn't retain heat			The wood will be very enticing on the eye due aging of the wood over a period of time, giving it an ashy wash.
2			The lower section of the seating will be made from concrete.			The concrete will be a very aesthetically pleasing hard material, due to the contrast from the vegetation around.
3			The upper section of the seating will be Ipe wood. This is because it is durable, resistant to rot and will allow more comfortable seating.			The feeling of the wood surface will be smooth and will have a natural warmth. People will also sit on the wooden planks.
4			Small wind chimes that will be incorporated into the trees. These will be made from copper as this will integrate well into the space.			Hearing the serene sounds of the wind chimes when the wind blows will create a calming environment.
5			Large wind chime sculptures that will stand alone within the SOUND area. The frame will be made from Ipe wood, like the decking and the chimes from aluminium			Hearing the serene sounds of the wind chimes when the wind blows will create a calming environment.
6			The demolished building is made from Limestone. Once cleaned and cleared it would be a very different look and the colours will stand out more in the brick.			Looking at the bricks of the building will give a sense of character and contrast of age.
7			Lighting will be incorporated into the main path areas, it will be LED lights, that are hung continuously across the site			Lights within the space will be a great way to feel safe in the evening and will enable them to see in the late afternoon
8			Large Stained glass sculptures. The frame will be from Ipe wood and the inner section is made from multiple coloured glass in the SIGHT section			This will be a great visual for the eyes, especially when the light hits the sculptures and projects around the space.
9			Bird feeders will be incorporated into the design and made from metal, in tube like shapes, with a glass centre.			Hearing the sounds of the birds will be very soothing on peoples ears and will create a very peaceful space.
