Academic Preparation

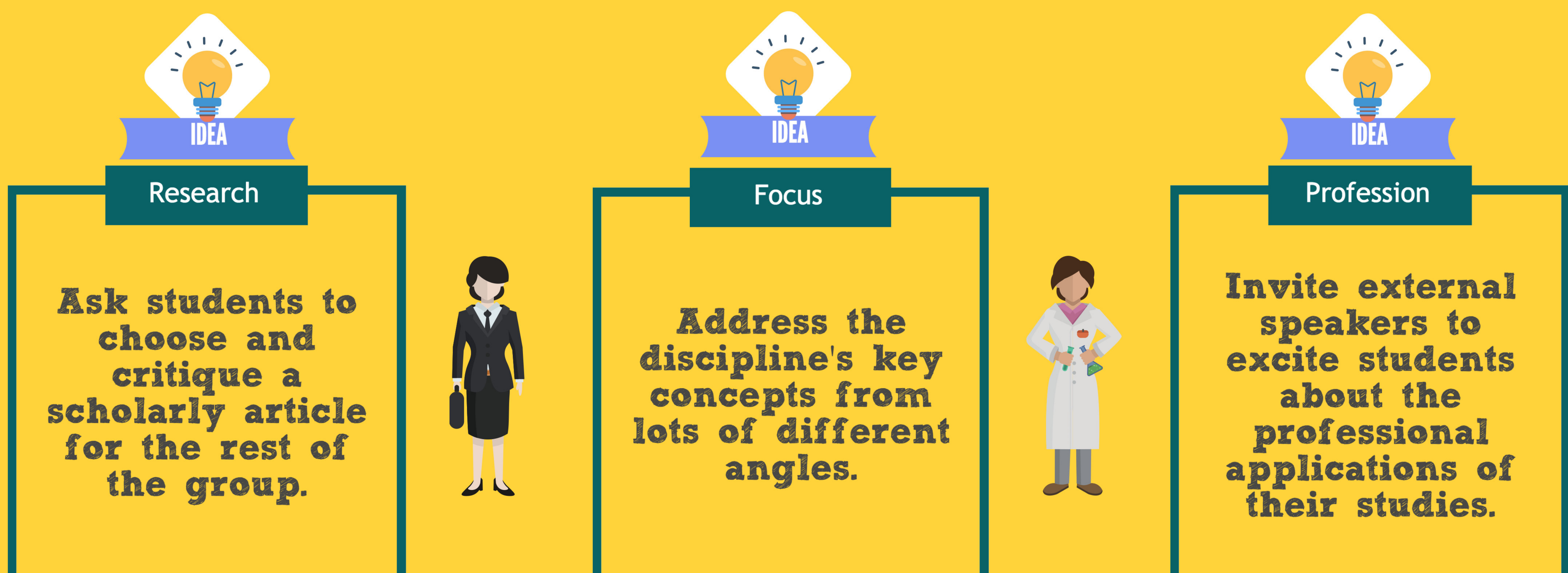
