The work sample and questionnaire should be submitted within 14 days of the date of receiving the invitation to submit.

Work Sample Guidelines

To make your application stand out, we will be looking for work that:

- Includes original research
- Demonstrates an ability to conduct interviews
- Is drawn towards current and social affairs or is of a topical nature
- Is not of a personal nature.

For your piece of work we are happy to accept one of the following:

- Written piece of work, such as a news article or feature (200 words)
- Evidence of radio or TV/film/video work you have been involved in
- Website or blog contribution (please include links).

Please only submit links or files in Microsoft Word format. If you have video or audio that you wish us to see, you can send us a link to a portfolio or upload these to YouTube or Soundcloud (or another media platform) and send the links. If you want to send part of a website or blog that you have contributed to then please include the web link in your submission.

When submitting your work please remember to include your **name and your UCAS personal ID number** so we can easily match it to your UCAS application. Your work will be reviewed by the BA (Hons) Journalism course team and it will be used, along with your qualifications, to help us decide on whether to make you an offer for a place on this course.

Please note that we may wish to arrange a chat online or over the phone to help with your application if we do not see you at an applicant day or an open day.

You'll be notified by UCAS of the result of your submission once a decision has been made.
