




# Scenario Based Learning

8th of the Month - April 2016

## Session Summary

Led by Bob Croft, FBL's Learning Technologist, this session offered staff an 'immersive learning' experience using the resources of FBL's new Hydra Suite.

<b>1. The Hydra Suite</b>

Bringing all groups together for discussion and review.



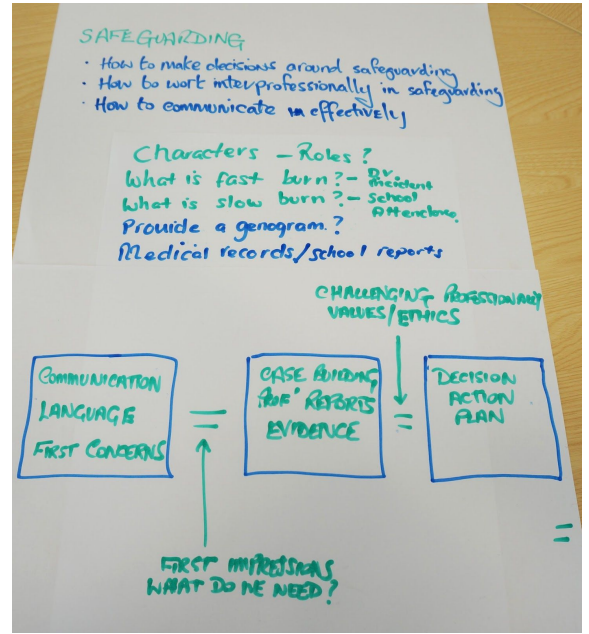
### 2. The Taster

Without explicitly defined roles staff were then asked to participate as students. Encouraged to contribute to a critical decision log, they needed to orient themselves both to unfamiliar technology and to the early stages of an ethical / PR crisis about to unfold for a clothing firm with a manufacturing base in the Far East.



### 3. The Application

Each group was then asked to agree learning outcomes & outline a generic scenario with broad appeal across disciplines. They are summarised here:

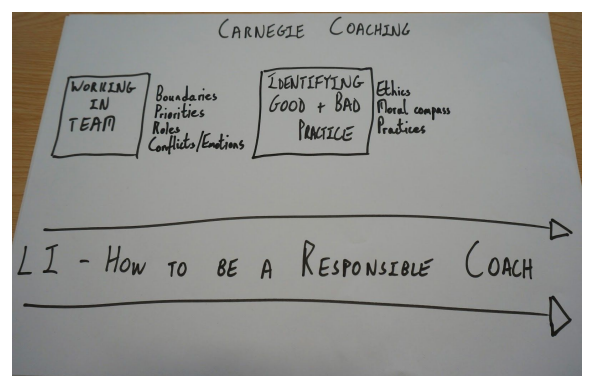
