#### Module Aims:

This module aims to give students the opportunity to:

- Advance bioscience based knowledge, of altered anatomy, physiology and the pathophysiology affecting
  infants within the ICU/HDS environment.
- Develop advanced clinical-practical knowledge and skills, via planning and effective care through high quality assessment and intervention strategies within the ICU/HDU environment.

#### Assessment:

Students will be assessed against level 6 or level 7 academic criteria on the following:

- Written case study focusing in on a clinical practice and management intervention in ICU/HDU:
  - o Level 6 2500 words
  - o Level 7 3500 words
- Neonatal clinical competencies portfolio supported by a range of evidence

#### Career Opportunities:

The 20 level 6 or level 7 credits you gain from the module can be used for further study towards a Degree or Masters programme.

#### **Entry Requirements:**

These modules are designed for practitioners working with health and social care clients. For admission to the module you will usually be required to provide evidence of the successful completion of 120 credits (or equivalent) at the appropriate level in a relevant area / discipline:

- 120 credits at level 5 (Dip HE) for level 6 (degree) study
- 120 credits at level 6 (BScH/BAH) for level 7 (masters) study

#### You must also:

- Be a Registered Nurse (Adult or Child branch) or Midwife
- Be qualified 2 years post-registration and currently working in the Neonatal speciality
- Have completed Neonatal Life Support (NLS) course or equivalent in house training
- Be able to evidence a minimum of 75 clinical practice hours over 2 years, caring for both Level 1 patients (requiring neonatal intensive care) and Level 2 patients (requiring high dependency care)
- Have evidence of meeting the standards for core Neonatal foundational clinical skills outlined within the RCN (2015)

### Remote Learning Prerequisites:

To undertake the course you must have access to a PC/laptop/device that has access to the internet and has sufficient memory and software to run MS Teams. It is recommended that this is run via the App rather than in a web browser. You will need to have practiced using this app and be able to use your webcam.
