

How much money do I need to have for my maintenance?

Students must show that they have money for their living costs for each month of their course, up to a maximum of nine months.

Length of course	Where they will study	Maintenance (funds needed)	Example	
Nine months or less	Outside of London	First year fees plus up to £3,045 (£1,015 per calendar month of the course, three months for the 10- week pre-sessional , to cover living costs)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Tuition fee for the course – for the 10 week pre-sessional English course £2,000 Student paid 100% to obtain CAS = £2,000 Outstanding tuition fee balance = £0 Living costs = £3,045* (as the course is only 10 weeks long students only need to evidence living costs for three months) Total of funds that should be available in their account = £3,045 	
More than nine months (one academic year)	Outside of London	First year fees plus £9,135 (£1,015 per calendar month of the course, up to a total nine months , to cover living costs)	<p>Undergraduate Example:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Tuition fees for first year of study (not including any discount) = £10,500 Student has paid 50% to obtain CAS = £5,250 Outstanding tuition fee balance = £5,250 Living costs = £9,135* Total of funds that should be available in their account = £14,385 	<p>Postgraduate Example:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Tuition fees for first year of study (not including any discount) = £11,300 Student has paid 50% to obtain CAS = £5,650 Outstanding tuition fee balance = £5,650 Living costs = £9,135* Total of funds that should be available in their account = £14,785

If you have paid the full amount of accommodation fees for your **Leeds Beckett University accommodation then, a maximum of £1,265 can be deducted from your living cost total.*
