- 1. Publicly demonstrate our commitment to the environment, continual improvement and the prevention of pollution by maintaining our external certification to the standard ISO 14001:2015
- 2. Reduce our carbon emissions in line with our carbon management strategy and international regulations through the effective use of space, utilities, goods and services
- 3. Promote sustainable forms of transport in accordance with the transport strategy of the city
- 4. Meet and, where appropriate, exceed the requirements of all relevant legislation. Where no regulation exists, we will set our own standards informed by relevant codes of practice and industry standards
- 5. Re-use equipment where possible, increase recycling and promote the use of recycled materials in products and buildings
- 6. Engage in two way dialogue with major suppliers, contractors and consultants to optimise the impact of their operations on the environment, society and the economy
- 7. Work pro-actively with the local authority, other universities and the community at large to progress sustainable initiatives and exchange best practice
- 8. Set publicly available objectives and targets and install management and training programmes to achieve them
- 9. Support the principles of sustainable literacy in relevant course curriculum, research and work experience.
