In the field below please give a brief outline of the project and what it entailed.

In March and April 2021, artist/photographer Lizzie Coombes and writer Peter Spafford completed a set of 'Poem Portraits' for the Manbassadors project. The ground-breaking Leeds project, Manbassadors, reaches out to isolated people to support their mental health with a simple intervention of bite-size support on a local level. It wanted to celebrate two years of success with a Poem Portrait Exhibition led by Space2 on lampposts across Harehills in East Leeds. Six Manbassadors took part in a Street Art project and are local business owners trained to identify signs of isolation and potential self-harm or suicide in their customers and who can provide information and signpost to support from a range of organisations.

Peter Spafford said: "I've never had poems on lampposts before – that's new for me. Sometimes in the past, we've [Lizzie and I] worked in a community centre and put all the portraits hanging on a washing line. People recognise others in their community and learn something about them that they didn't know before.





"The fact they're in public view is a way for people to realise that's not just somebody who's a face, they have a life and strong feelings about things, a conviction about the way they work. It's a way for people to connect. It's very rare that you see a poem so big on a building or a lamppost. It's something to stop people in their tracks and maybe bring a bit of light relief, a bit of a spring in their step."
