Brief Description of Project (250-1000 words max.)

In the field below please give a brief outline of the project and what it entailed.

The portrait series started as Lizzie's response to the 'lockdown' by photographing the people she encountered during her permitted daily exercise.

Originally described as 'social distancing' portraits, Lizzie realised that the portraits were much more about the physical distance and the process of taking the pictures was social, giving her and those she photographed an opportunity to connect and communicate outside of the online worlds that have become





the norm. Some people appear more than once, but all are friends who've either come to say a 'physically' distanced hi or she's encountered during her daily exercise. Others she arranged to see by running or cycling to their doorsteps. Two she drove to when the 'lockdown' restrictions were eased, and the portraits alter to reflect this, to include people meeting in parks or sitting in friends' gardens.

The large picture for April is a selection from a mini portrait series I undertook on the day I would have run London marathon. I marked the day by taking 26.2 portraits of members of my running club, the Hyde Park Harriers, running in between them to cover a half marathon distance.


