The project took place at Convention House, Leeds in 2019. Convention House is situated in Mabgate, Leeds.

Formerly a convent and then used as an accountant for the last 37 years, this Victorian large-scale terraced building has recently been redeveloped into a unique creative space by East Street Arts.





Devised and curated by Marion Harrison and commissioned by East Street Arts, this project aimed to critically, practically and technically test the potential scope of this new space through innovative, idiosyncratic, exploratory and inventive uses and implementation of technology, digital material, image, construction, words, systems, encounter and group learning.

The project involved working with the following artists: Laura Grace Ford, Dominic Allan, Alex De Little, Sophie Chapman and Kerri Jefferis, Stuart Mellor, Marnie Simpson, Jon Orlek, Jake Krushell, Alfie Kungu, Sable Radio and Ben Dalton.

Through residencies, workshops and projects the artists tested the possibilities of the space for production and presentation of work. Some worked closely with the surrounding neighbourhood and city and the project culminated in an exhibition event in November 2019.

In addition, there were 6 billboards installed on Marsh Lane overlooking Convention House from Oct 1019 – March 2020.

These billboards formed part of the first artist-run project at Convention House. The billboard was viewable from a wide range of infrastructural, social and architectural vantage points, including from one of the UK's shortest motorway sections and from Convention House itself.

Dominic from Luton, Laura Grace Ford, Sophie Chapman & Kerri Jefferis (curated by Marion Harrison) Jessie Brennen, Tara Collette and Andy Edwards (curated by Alan Dunn) responded to these short and long viewing perspectives to question how closely or critically we actually view and remember images from the fringes of our cities.
