The Module

The aim of the module is to enable students to consider their future study in the context of current health and social care policy, and their professional learning. It also provides a means of meeting the needs of students who require support in putting together a professional profile of evidence to **gain accreditation for prior learning and /or advanced standing for previous study**. It may also provide a useful means of evidencing your ability to study at a particular academic level and refresh your study skills if you have not undertaken academic work for some time.

By the end of module students will be able to:

- Critically reflect on their experiences, past learning and achievements
- Discuss in detail the relevance of the proposed scheme of study for both their personal and professional development drawing on the contemporary literature on professional development
- Negotiate and articulate individual learning outcomes, for their future scheme of study
- Critically explore current health and social care policy and implications for service users/patients

Assessment

Students will be assessed on a portfolio of evidence to include:

- A reflective synopsis critically analysing their role in health and social care and their current learning needs (2000 - 3000 words)
 - A Personal Development Plan which outlines their future scheme of study.
 - An extended Curriculum Vitae
- For students submitting for APEL/APL purposes
- A more comprehensive portfolio mapped against appropriate learning outcomes

Career Opportunities

The credits you gain from the module can be used for further study – towards a Diploma, Degree or Masters Programme.

Entry Requirements

These modules are designed for practitioners working with health and social care clients. For admission to the module you will be required to provide evidence of the successful completion of 120 credits (or equivalent) at the appropriate level in a relevant area / discipline.

CPD Funded places are available to NHS Staff and non NHS staff whose organisations provide placements for NHS pre- registration students. You must have the support of your manager.
