Counselling Skills Introduction

Short course (2 Days) – Check availability and book a place by clicking above title

This course aims to help develop practical listening skills and is open to anyone with a keen interest in further counselling training.

This course is mandatory for PG Certificate applicants who have not completed a short face-to-face counselling skills course (minimum 12 hours study) or equivalent training.

Certificate (CertHE) Interpersonal & Counselling Skills

Level 4 / 120 credits / 2 years part time

Introduction to the knowledge and theory of counselling ethics and theoretical approaches, mainly reflective based study exploring your own feelings, attitudes and personal relational issues.

Entry requirements include

- A-Level or equivalent Level 3 award.
- Applicants are required to attend an interview as part of the selection process

Postgraduate Certificate (PG Cert) Interpersonal & Counselling Skills

Level 7 / 60 credits / 1 year part time

Introduction to the knowledge and theory of counselling ethics and theoretical approaches, mainly reflective based study exploring your own feelings, attitudes and personal relational issues.

Entry requirements include

- Normally a second class honours degree
- Completion of face-to-face short course in counselling skills (minimum 12hours study) - our 'Counselling Skills Introduction' weekend course would satisfy this requirement
- Applicants are required to attend an interview as part of the selection process

Diploma (DipHE) Therapeutic Counselling

Level 5 / 120 credits / 2 years part time

This course provides education and training that meets the standard for professional accreditation with the BACP (British Association for Counselling & Psychotherapy, see <http://www.bacp.co.uk>), and includes a placement with an approved supervisor.

Entry requirements include

- CertHE or equivalent Level 4 award
- Completion of a minimum of 90 hours counselling training (face-to-face skills and theory)
- Applicants are required to attend an interview as part of the selection process

Postgraduate Diploma (PG Dip) Counselling & Psychotherapy

Level 7 / 120 credits / 2 years part time

This course provides education and training that meets the standard for professional accreditation with the BACP (British Association for Counselling & Psychotherapy, see <http://www.bacp.co.uk>), and includes a placement with an approved supervisor.

Entry requirements include

- Normally a second class honours degree
- Completion of a minimum of 90 hours counselling training (face-to-face skills and theory)
- Applicants are required to attend an interview as part of the selection process

BSc (Hons) Therapeutic Counselling

Level 6 / 120 credits (top up) / 1 year full time or 2 years part time

This is an academic 'top-up' course aimed at practitioners wishing to increase their expertise in their professional setting and improve their practice.

Entry requirements include

- DipHE or equivalent Level 5 counselling award
- Formal training in counselling/psychotherapy and professional membership of BACP or similar organisation

MA Psychotherapy

Level 7 / 60 credits (top-up)* / 1 year part time

This is an academic 'top-up' course aimed at counselling or psychotherapy postgraduates wishing to top up their qualification to a full Masters award through further research into an area of interest

Entry requirements include

- Postgraduate Diploma in Counselling/Psychotherapy or equivalent professional training
- Applicants are required to attend an interview unless progressing from the Leeds Beckett PG Diploma in Counselling & Psychotherapy

MA Psychological Therapies

This is an academic full Masters qualification (180 credits) aimed at practitioners wishing to increase their expertise in their professional setting and improve their practice. This is open to those who have completed the BSc (Hons) Therapeutic Counselling or as an alternative to the MA Psychotherapy for those who wish to study further modules with us.

Entry requirements include

- Second class honours degree
- Membership of relevant professional body with code of ethics and access to appropriate practice
- Applicants are required to attend an interview as part of the selection process
